# The Clash Between Constitutional Rights and Policing

This summer, several members of the Black Lives Matter crowd were pepper sprayed while demonstrating against excessive force by law enforcement. Last year, a young man was shot to death by police in a Cincinnati-area Walmart for holding an air rifle, although Ohio is an open-carry state. Recently, the Eight District Court of Appeals found there was no “consensual” search and seizure when nine officers surrounded a group of individuals without “reasonable suspicion” that any member of the group was committing or about to commit a crime. These incidents took place against a backdrop of nationwide, record-high gun violence and heightened mistrust between police and citizens.

The balancing act between urban policing and the free exercise of Constitutional rights is delicate. This course will examine the tension between these two values and how it can be managed. It will also examine the over-criminalization and unequal application of criminal laws in “high crime” areas compared to other communities. The potential criminalization of the exercise of the 1st, 2nd and 4th Amendment rights will be explored. There will be a discussion about how society is impacted when the protection of constitutional rights is in conflict with community safety objectives.
